The Opportunity:

The mission of the Division of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care Medicine at the University of California, Irvine (UCI) School of Medicine is to provide compassionate, high-quality care to our patients; to nurture innovation in research, and to teach patients, families, medical trainees, and ancillary health care providers about lung health, disease, and treatment.

These specialists have extensive expertise in bedside critical care ultrasound screening and provide instruction in a range of didactic and simulation training programs for intensive care-based ultrasound testing.

Due to departmental growth and programmatic expansion, the Division of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care Medicine at UCI Health is currently recruiting for a full-time, subspecialty trained <u>Interventional</u> <u>Pulmonologist</u> to join the highly active Department of Medicine. The successful candidate will be an excellent clinician with a strong commitment to clinical training, research, and educational programs.



Where You'll Work:

- <u>Innovation in Interventional Pulmonology</u>: Our team is one of the first in the state to perform minimally invasive therapeutic procedures with a specialized airway recannulization and tumor debulking device.
- Board-certified Interventional Pulmonologists use <u>minimally invasive techniques</u> to diagnose and treat the full range of lung diseases. These include both cancer and benign diseases, such as: Severe asthma, Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, Interstitial lung disease, Tracheal stenosis, Pleural disease.
- Most procedures are performed by bronchoscopy. Conducts studies using most advanced laser technologies.
- Interventional Pulmonology Caseload: Currently one IP on staff, seeing an average of 4-6 patients per day.
- Access to on-site Interventional Pulmonary Suite with anesthesia.

Position Summary:

The <u>Interventional Pulmonologist</u> will be expected to deliver patient care in an academic setting, teach medical students, residents, fellows, engage in an independent and extramurally – funded clinical research program, and provide service to the University. Additionally, the <u>Core Faculty member in Interventional Pulmonology</u> will continue to build the clinical activities of the program and bring a strong research component to the division. Candidates with current funding are preferred, but candidates who apply for funding once hired will be considered.

The Interventional Pulmonologist reports to the UCI Division Chief of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care Medicine.

Key Responsibilities:

Essential Duties:

- Providing and supervising direct patient care through minimally invasive diagnostic procedures to treat the full range of lung diseases.
- Teach residents, subspecialty fellows, and medical students.
- Perform public and University services.
- An active research program is desirable. Academic credentials including NIH or other federal grants and prior record of high impact publications are a plus.

Excellent teaching is an essential criterion for appointment. Priority will be given to candidates with a proven track record of academic productivity, as demonstrated through high-impact publications, thematic-based research, and/or grant funding.

- M.D. or M.D./Ph.D. degree(s) or equivalent.

- Satisfactory completion of an Internal Medicine residency and Pulmonary/Critical Care fellowship from an ACGME accredited program. Applicant must have completed an Interventional Pulmonary Fellowship by date of hire.
- Active and unrestricted California Medical License or eligibility for State of California Medical Licensure.
- Research and funding, including NIH and/or other federal awards and a prior record of high impact publications is a plus.
- Interest in clinical teaching.
- Rank and academic track will be commensurate with candidate training, qualifications, and experience.

The **Division of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care Medicine** at the <u>UCI School of Medicine</u> is committed to providing quality care for patients with a broad range of lung diseases and conditions through clinical training, research and educational programs.

Our faculty members are recognized experts in interventional pulmonary medicine and in the diagnosis and treatment of complex airway



problems. In fact, five of our <u>nine faculty members</u> — including **one of the world leaders in this field of medicine** — have been specially trained in interventional pulmonary medicine. **Few pulmonary medicine training programs in the United States offer this level of expertise.**

Advanced care:

At <u>UCI Medical Center</u>, we deliver state-of-the-art care to patients who have pulmonary disease or critical illness, including pleural diseases, malignant mesothelioma, asthma, chronic bronchitis and cough, emphysema, lung cancer, pneumonia, and tuberculosis. These specialists have extensive expertise in bedside critical care ultrasound screening and provide instruction in a range of didactic and simulation training programs for intensive care-based ultrasound testing.

Our pulmonary and critical care specialists also run the intensive care units at the <u>VA Long Beach Healthcare System</u> and our fellows rotate through the intensive care unit at Long Beach Memorial Medical Center. These settings give our fellows, residents, and medical students valuable experience in treating a wide variety of patients and conditions.

Interventional Pulmonology Services:

Our board-certified interventional pulmonologists perform the following procedures:

- Flexible bronchoscopy
- Rigid bronchoscopy
- Endobronchial ultrasound (EBUS) and radial probe endobronchial ultrasound (REBUS)
- Electromagnetic navigation bronchoscopy (EMN)
- EMN or EBUS placement of fiducial markers for stereotactic radiation
- Bronchial thermoplasty (BT)
- Argon plasma coagulation (APC)
- Balloon dilation
- Cryosurgery and spray cryotherapy
- Airway stenting
- Transbronchial cryobiopsy
- Medical thoracoscopy
- Tunneled pleural catheter
- Endobronchial valves The Spiration[®] endobronchial valve device has been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for humanitarian use to control prolonged air leaks of the lung after lobectomy, segmentectomy, or lung volume reduction surgery. This FDA Humanitarian Device Exemption is the first for a bronchial valve procedure.

Research Emphasis:

Division faculty members receive significant research funding, primarily from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' merit program, the Department of Defense, and the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Our faculty members have a number of clinical research projects relating to **interventional pulmonary medicine** as well as studies on the best methods for training physicians in interventional procedures.

The division also runs an active sleep lab program at the VA's center for research and clinical care. This gives our residents and fellows numerous opportunities to participate in advanced scientific research.

Research Opportunities:

In addition, division residents, fellows, and medical students participate in translational research studies conducted by our faculty members with the UCI Health <u>Beckman Laser Institute</u>. This collaboration enables our



pulmonary and critical care clinicians and researchers to conduct studies using the most advanced laser technologies to develop new techniques and therapies for a host of pulmonary and critical care disorders.

Above all, faculty members in the Division of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care Medicine at the UCI School of Medicine are dedicated to providing compassionate and leading-edge care to our patients.
